MAJOR QUAKE ROCKS HAITI. Tuesday evening as we were all preparing to sit down to dinner a major earthquake (7.2 on the Richter scale) shook Port-au Prince. The epicenter of the quake was reported to be Carrefour, a town approximately three miles west of the center of Port-au-Prince. Our parish has two outreach activities in Haiti: Maison Fortune Orphanage and School in Hinche, approximately 70 miles north of Port-au-Prince; and The L'Ouverture-Cleary School (LCS), five miles north of the center of Port-au-Prince. Although I have not received reports from Hinche, I have talked with Patrick Moynihan, President of the Haitian Project which supports LCS in Port-au-Prince. He has been in contact with people at the school and indicates that the school buildings appear to be intact, but the students are sleeping outside tonight and will remain outside until the buildings are cleared for re-entry. Of the 300+ student body, only three students received injuries with one of them being a potentially serious head injury. We anticipate a significant need for water, food and engineering support throughout the area in the immediate future. Although he just returned from Haiti Monday, Patrick is trying to arrange transportation back to the school as soon as possible. Haiti needs our prayers now more than ever. If, in addition to the power of your prayer, you would like to donate to either of the schools or to the general relief of Haiti, there will be information to enable you to do so at the Haiti Outreach table, following all Masses this weekend, during the Ministry Fair in the Parish Hall.

RCIA Corner for January 17, 2009

The Prince of Peace Inquirers, Candidates and Catechumens have enjoyed the Christmas season with us. They are now looking forward to the remainder of the RCIA process leading up to the Easter Vigil. Surprising at it may seem, we are now over a third of the way from Christmas to Ash Wednesday! Recently, the participants learned about what the Sacrament of Marriage means to a Catholic: it is a covenant made between husband and wife, and which the Church celebrates the permanence, faithfulness and fruitfulness they promise to share as a couple. The formation and discernment process our catechumens and candidates are now experiencing, and the Rites before the Easter Vigil, mark an intensity of experience as they hear more clearly the calling towards our Lord. Topics such as the Sacrament of Reconciliation, sin and morality, and the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick help them focus on the sacrifice that God made in offering his only Son for us all. The Rites between now and the Easter Vigil include a Rite of Acceptance for our remaining inquirer, a sending of the Catechumens to the Rite of Election before the Bishop, and a Call to Continuing Conversion for our Candidate (more on these in future bulletins). From now through the Vigil, this is also a time for us as a community to turn our attention to them through our prayers and Masses, as we prepare to greet them into the fullness of communion with the universal Church.

Stop Abortion Funding in Health Care Reform!

Protect Conscience

Ensure Affordable Health Coverage

Allow Immigrants to Purchase Private Health Insurance

As long-time advocates of health care reform, the U.S. Catholic bishops continue to make the moral case that genuine health care reform must protect the life, dignity, consciences and health of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Health care reform should not advance a pro-abortion agenda in our country.

- On November 7, the U.S. House of Representatives passed major health care reform that reaffirms the essential, longstanding and widely supported policy against using federal funds for elective abortions and includes positive measures on affordability and immigrants.
- On December 24, the U.S. Senate rejected this policy and passed health care reform that requires federal funds to help subsidize and promote health plans that cover elective abortions. All purchasers of such plans will be required to pay for other people's abortions through a separate payment solely to pay for abortion.
- Outside the abortion context, neither bill has adequate conscience protection for health care providers, plans or employers.
- These two bills must now be combined into one bill that both the House and Senate will vote on in final form. Provisions against abortion funding and in favor of conscience protection, affordability, and immigrants' access to health care must be part of a fair and just health care reform bill, or the final bill must be opposed.

MESSAGE—HOUSE:

"I am pleased that the House health care bill maintains the longstanding policy against federal funding of abortion. I urge you to work to uphold essential provisions against abortion funding, to include full conscience protection and to assure that health care is accessible and affordable for all. Until and unless these criteria are met, I urge you to oppose the final bill."

MESSAGE—SENATE:

"I am deeply disappointed that the Senate health care bill fails to maintain the longstanding policy against federal funding of abortion and does not include adequate protection for conscience. I urge you to support essential provisions against abortion funding, similar to those in the House bill. Include full conscience protection and assure that health care is accessible and affordable for all. Until and unless these criteria are met, I urge you to oppose the final bill."

WHEN: Votes in the House and Senate on the final bill are expected in January.
