HAITI RELIEF

Members of Prince of Peace,

Thank you for your interest in the Haiti Project and your desire to help the people and especially the Children of Haiti. We will have many things that might interest you in helping over the long term, both for the Maison Fortune' Orphanage and the Louverture Cleary School.

I just finished an emergency meeting of the Maison Fortune' Orphanage Foundation to discuss the immediate need to prepare for an onslaught of new orphans that have been generated by the natural disaster. The town of Hinche has seen its population double in the past few days as a result of the Haitian people seeking a safe and stable environment. All the markets are closed or the prices of food and diesel fuel have doubled. The orphanage is one of only a few sanctuaries with food, water and lodging, so naturally we believe people will bring orphans to Maison Fortune'. The foundation wants to be prepared and it is making plans to lease additional housing if they can get donors and sponsors to support the increase in orphan population. We will need major donors, so if you know of any businesses looking for a way to support Haiti Relief, please let me know. We are working on a Strategic Communication plan and will start a media blitz within the next couple of days that may generate the attention we need.

The Foundation has several committees that work things like marketing, health, education, sponsorships, endowment, strategic planning, and development. We have immediate needs for volunteers in the following areas. Please let me know if you can help.

- Assistant to the Executive Director
- Assistant to the Treasurer (accountant experience)

RCIA Corner for January 24, 2009

This past Wednesday, the Prince of Peace catechumens and candidates took another step of discernment to their entry into the Church and on their very individual faith journeys. Sister Bernadette from the Sisters of the Immaculate Heart of Mary gave a presentation on the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the renewing of friendship with our Creator that follows a sincere Sacrament. This session came after the previous week's presentation on sin and morality, and further prepared the participants for the serious yet glorious Easter Sacraments of Initiation. The participants edged a little closer to understanding the fullness of faith that all Catholics enjoy. In two weeks, the Catechumens will be sent to the Bishop for their formal entry into the "Elect" of the Diocese to receive those Sacraments. And shortly after that, the Candidates, who are already baptized in the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, will be welcomed to continue their journey towards the change in heart involved in joining this same fullness of faith in our Holy Mother the Church.
