HAITI RELIEF

Members of Prince of Peace,

Thank you for your interest in the Haiti Project and your desire to help the people and especially the Children of Haiti. We will have many things that might interest you in helping over the long term, both for the Maison Fortune' Orphanage and the Louverture Cleary School.

I just finished an emergency meeting of the Maison Fortune' Orphanage Foundation to discuss the immediate need to prepare for an onslaught of new orphans that have been generated by the natural disaster. The town of Hinche has seen its population double in the past few days as a result of the Haitian people seeking a safe and stable environment. All the markets are closed or the prices of food and diesel fuel have doubled. The orphanage is one of only a few sanctuaries with food, water and lodging, so naturally we believe people will bring orphans to Maison Fortune'. The foundation wants to be prepared and it is making plans to lease additional housing if they can get donors and sponsors to support the increase in orphan population. We will need major donors, so if you know of any businesses looking for a way to support Haiti Relief, please let me know. We are working on a Strategic Communication plan and will start a media blitz within the next couple of days that may generate the attention we need.

The Foundation has several committees that work things like marketing, health, education, sponsorships, endowment, strategic planning, and development. We have immediate needs for volunteers in the following areas. Please let me know if you can help.

RCIA CORNER FOR FEBRUARY 7, 2010

The RCIA catechumens and candidates are preparing for entry into the Church very soon. Lent begins on February 17th. For the catechumens, this marks the beginning of the Period of Purification and Enlightenment in which they deeply review their path to Christ's love, and during which our community helps them in this discernment. This ends with the Triduum and Easter celebrations. Today they experience a "Rite of Sending to the Bishop." This is our community's sending them with our blessing to the Church of the Immaculate Conception in Hampton on Saturday, February 20th, where Bishop Emeritus Sullivan will welcome them into the Elect of Christ. Today at the 11:00AM Mass, each catechumen will sign the Prince of Peace "Book of the Elect", in which the names of all who seek entrance into the body of Christ must be entered. We send them to the Bishop to formally be enrolled. We also have a baptized candidate studying with the catechumens. On Sunday February 21st here at Prince of Peace, our candidate will be called to continuing conversion. This is a special Rite in which she is called to the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist. At the end of Lent at the Easter Vigil, those catechumens and candidates who have completed their individual discernment journeys are united with us in the

Sacraments. Please continue to pray for them, and thank you for doing just that this past year!
