HAITI UPDATE: Maison Fortune' Orphanage has seen its city of Hinche swell from 30,000 people to over 60,000 making food and diesel fuel scarce. The Orphanage children are doing well, though they are out of school until the teachers can come back. We have seen an increase in the number of people come to the orphanage compound because it has food. Because of the catastrophe, we have also seen an increase of orphans that have lost their parents. The Maison Fortune' Orphanage Foundation has leased another facility and can handle another 100 orphans. 60 Orphans have already arrived and will be cared for until the Foundation can find them a home. We expect to receive more.

Louverture Cleary School is recovering slowly. The school has served as a recovery center for the area of Port Au Prince while it recovers. Children and Teachers are slowly returning to school, but as they return we learn of family loss and suffering. Although the Minister of Education has not allowed schools in the Port Au Prince area to resume operations, our school leadership indicates that they are about 75% back to pre-quake operational capacity. In addition to bringing the school back to full capacity, the faculty and students are providing direct support to medical teams (primarily as translators), assisting local community members with emergency housing, and distributing food relief. Spirits are positive in the local area but the Port Au Prince city center remains in shock. Please be generous and donate to the Haiti Lenten Appeal to support our goal of \$40,000 for both of these programs. God Bless, Rick Martin

RCIA CORNER FOR FEBRUARY 28, 2010

Last Sunday, the candidates in RCIA adult and RCIC children formally declared their intentions to continue their journeys to participate in the Catholic faith during a ceremony at Prince of Peace. The catechumens are now the "Elect for Christ" after their election was declared by Bishop Emeritus Walter Sullivan in a moving ceremony in Hampton on February 20th. They are now in the RCIA "Period of Purification and Enlightenment" as they draw closer to their baptism, confirmation and first Eucharist. This period is concurrent with Lent. During the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent at the 11:00AM Mass, they will experience the Three Scrutinies. Because they are asking for the sacraments of initiation, the Elect must have the intention of achieving an intimate knowledge of Christ and his Church. They are expected to progress both in genuine self-knowledge through examination of their lives and in true repentance. These rites include prayers for them that quite clearly call on God's power over evil to protect these good people in their lifetime journeys. These rites complete the transformation of the Elect in delivering them from the power of sin and Satan. Your prayers for them are especially important during Lent—please continue to pray for them, and may God bless each of you this Lenten season!
